powering a mini-fridge. The 42000mAh capacity isn't just marketing fluff - it's enough to recharge an iPhone 14 over 20 times. But wait, there's a catch...

Actually, scratch that. There's no catch if you're using it as intended. A recent Yellowstone camper reported: "It powered our LED lights, drone, and portable shower for 3 days straight. We never touched the solar panel - just pre-charged it at home."

Q: How long does it take to charge via solar?

A: With ideal sunlight, about 8-10 hours using the included panel. Pro tip: Pair it with a 60W USB-C charger for faster wall charging.

Q: Can it power medical devices?

A: Yes, but check wattage requirements. The 155Wh capacity handles most CPAP machines for 8+ hours.

Q: What's the warranty like?

A: Aimtom offers 18 months coverage - longer than industry average. One user told us they replaced a 2-year-old unit no questions asked!
