- Property tax exemptions in 58 counties

Wait, no - let's correct that. The property tax benefit applies statewide, but appraisal rules vary. A Houston homeowner saved \$9,000 over 5 years using this exemption, while still increasing their home value by 4.1% according to Zillow data.

### Net Metering Myths vs. Reality

"But doesn't Texas ban net metering?" We hear this question weekly. The truth is more nuanced. While there's no statewide mandate, 73% of Texans live in areas with utility-specific programs. CPS Energy in San Antonio offers 1:1 kWh credits, effectively turning homes into mini power plants.

Let's picture this: The Martinez family in Austin installed a 8kW system last spring. Through Texas solar incentives, they:

- Claimed \$7,800 in federal tax credits
- Received \$1,200 from Austin Energy's rebate
- Eliminated \$140/month electricity bills

Their secret? Timing the installation during Oncor's seasonal battery storage promotion. Now they're weathering summer blackouts while neighbors sweat it out.
